Ephesians 1:11-end

A reading from the letter to the Ephesians.

All things are done according to God's plan and decision; and God chose us to be his own people in union with Christ because of his own purpose, based on what he had decided from the very beginning. Let us, then, who were the first to hope in Christ, praise God's glory! And you also became God's people when you heard the true message, the Good News that brought you salvation. You believed in Christ, and God put his stamp of ownership on you by giving you the Holy Spirit he had promised. The Spirit is the guarantee that we shall receive what God has promised his people, and this assures us that God will give complete freedom to those who are his. Let us praise his glory! For this reason, ever since I heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for all God's people, I have not stopped giving thanks to God for you. I remember you in my prayers and ask the God of our

Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, to give you the Spirit, who will make you wise and reveal God to you, so that you will know him. I ask that your minds may be opened to see his light, so that you will know what is the hope to which he has called you, how rich are the wonderful blessings he promises his people, and how very great is his power at work in us who believe. This power working in us is the same as the mighty strength which he used when he raised Christ from death and seated him at his right side in the heavenly world. Christ rules there above all heavenly rulers, authorities, powers, and lords; he has a title superior to all titles of authority in this world and in the next. God put all things under Christ's feet and gave him to the church as supreme Lord over all things. The church is Christ's body, the completion of him who himself completes all things everywhere.

The Liturgy of Baptism

Faith is the gift of God to his people. In baptism the Lord is adding to our number those whom he is calling.

People of God, will you welcome Hebe and uphold her in her new life in Christ?

All With the help of God, we will.

*The priest then says to the parents
and godparents:*

Parents and godparents,
the Church receives Hebe with joy. Today we are trusting God for her growth in faith. Will you pray for her, draw her by your example into the community of faith and walk with her in the way of Christ?

P/GP With the help of God, we will.

In baptism Hebe begins her journey in faith. You speak for her today. Will you care for her and help her to take her place within the life and worship of Christ's Church?

P/GP With the help of God, we will.

The Decision

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him. Therefore I ask: Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God?

P/GP I reject them.

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil?

P/GP I renounce them.

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour?

P/GP I repent of them.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

P/GP I turn to Christ.

Do you submit to Christ as Lord?

P/GP I submit to Christ.

Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life?

P/GP I come to Christ.

The Signing with the Cross

The priest makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of the candidate, saying:

Christ claims you for his own.
Receive the sign of his cross.

The priest invites the godparents to sign the candidate with the cross.

When the candidate has been signed, the priest says:

Do not be ashamed to confess
the faith of Christ crucified.

All **Fight valiantly as a
disciple of Christ against sin,
the world and the devil and
remain faithful to Christ to the
end of your life.**

May almighty God deliver you
from the powers of darkness,
restore in you the image of his
glory and lead you in the light
and obedience of Christ.

The Prayer Over Water

Praise God who made heaven
and earth,

All **who keeps his promise for ever.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord
our God.

All **It is right to give thanks

We thank you, almighty God,
for the gift of water to sustain,
refresh and cleanse all life.
Over water the Holy Spirit
moved in the beginning of
creation. Through water you
led the children of Israel from
slavery in Egypt to freedom in
the Promised Land. In water
your Son Jesus received the
baptism of John and was
anointed by the Holy Spirit as
the Messiah, the Christ, to
lead us from the death of sin
to newness of life.

We thank you, Father, for the
water of baptism. In it we are
buried with Christ in his
death. By it we share in his
resurrection. Through it we
are reborn by the Holy Spirit.
Therefore, in joyful obedience
to your Son, we baptize into
his fellowship those who
come to him in faith.

Now sanctify this water that,
by the power of your Holy
Spirit, Hebe may be cleansed
from sin and born again.
Renewed in your image, may
she walk by the light of faith
and continue for ever in the
risen life of Jesus Christ our
Lord; to whom with you and
the Holy Spirit be all honour
and glory, now and for ever.

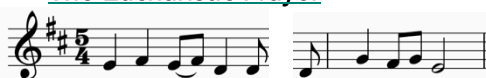

In communion with angels and archangels, and with all who served you on earth and worship you now in heaven, we raise our voice to proclaim your glory, for ever praising you and singing:

We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son. On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you. He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: Take, eat; this is my body which is given

for you; do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine. Again he praised you, gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross. Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Great is the mystery of faith.

All **Christ has died.
Christ is risen.
Christ will come again.**

Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth. Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with the Blessed Virgin Mary, St Margaret and

all the saints to feast at your table in heaven. Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever.
