Curate's update

On Tuesday afternoon I went to Ashmead Care Home, where I lead a service once a fortnight. Over the years I have come to know residents, their families, and the staff well. It is always a warm and joyful time as we sing, pray, and share together, with residents and staff helping to lead, taking the chalice, reading scripture, and participating fully.

This week we reflected on Mark 4:1–20, the parable of the sower: God as the gardener, the Word as the seed, and our hearts as the soil. It was a peaceful time of shared faith and life experience, including stories of God's work and even of gardening. We shared the peace and finished by singing *All Things Bright and Beautiful*.

These gatherings remind me that good ministry is about "doing with" rather than "doing to." The residents call these times "church," and for those who attend regularly, it truly is their church, a place of belonging, choice, and participation.

Later that day I was asked to return to Ashmead to lead an end-of-life service for a faithful woman of God. With her family and staff at her bedside we prayed, sang her favourite hymns, anointed her with oil, and shared scripture. Amid tears, laughter, memories, and music, it was a deeply holy and privileged moment.

Many residents at Ashmead have few, if any, visitors. If you feel called to be part of this ministry, please do get in touch with me.
