## Curate's update

Ash Wednesday opens the season of Lent with a quiet but powerful invitation: to pause, to reflect, and to return to God. As ashes are traced on our foreheads, we are reminded of our human frailty and our deep need for grace. The words "*Remember that you are dust*" speak not of despair, but of truth, truth that grounds us in humility and dependence on God.

The holiness of this day lies in its honesty. Ash Wednesday does not pretend that life is without struggle or sin. Instead, it invites us to bring our whole selves before God, trusting in mercy rather than perfection. The ashes, marked in the shape of the cross, remind us that even in our brokenness, we belong to Christ.

This day sets the purpose of Lent before us: Through prayer, fasting, and generosity, we begin a journey of renewal, making space for God to reshape us in love and lead us towards a new life.

I look forward to seeing you at one of our services, at 11am a quiet reflective time of worship together, and at 7pm with choral music from our wonderful choir.
