Curate's Reflection

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

Each January individuals pray, and churches and ecumenical organisations celebrate the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity in a variety of ways, bringing together Christians from across the traditions in prayer and worship. Churches Together in Putney held a service of prayer for Christian Unity on Wednesday at Putney Methodist Church. It was good to join friends from other places of worship to share worship and prayer together

This year the passage from Ephesians 4 v 1-13 was used as the central text. It calls believers to live worthy of their calling by embracing humility, patience, and love, striving for unity in the one Spirit, one body, and one God, and recognizing Christ's gifting of apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors, and teachers to build up the church to mature in faith and knowledge of Jesus, reaching the full stature of Christ. *"There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling."*

So I encourage you to pray for the church across the world, especially in places which are fragile, vulnerable, where there is conflict, where there is persecution.
