And then on Tuesday we had a full house for Little Maggie's baby and Toddler group. Today was no exception when Ibstock School visited with their teacher Yvette, many of you will remember her parents Claire and Martin Fennell who were members of this church. We told the story of Easter through a drama, starting with the children holding palm crosses and Jesus and his disciples entering Jerusalem, we then made our way to the altar where we talked about the Last Supper and explained what the Eucharist is and the children tasted the wafers and the wine (some quite enjoyed the wine)! and then we finished in the Lady Chapel to talk about the reason why Jesus died. We then looked at the stained-glass windows which they are doing a project on at school.

And today on Mothering Sunday our children have planned, written and rehearsed the service, organised a cake sale and as usual been a blessing to us. I hope they know just how much we value them.
