On bank holiday Monday after the busy Easter services, I packed my suitcase and went to Penhurst Retreat Centre for the week. An old manor house, originally a place for missionaries, situated about three miles from Battle near Hastings. I love this place, the sound of birdsong, geese honking, ducks splashing down on the pond, and the very occasional rumble of a tractor on the lane. It was good to stop and be still after the busy Easter services. As soon as I walked up the path I could feel the sacredness of this place, it's often described as a thin place, Thin places are deeply rooted in Celtic Christianity and are thought to be places where heaven and earth meet.

Nearby there is Ten Acre Gill, and I had heard that the blue bells were out. And so I went in the cool of the morning, and what I found in this wood in every available space was carpets of bluebells and wild garlic. I sat for a long time just taking it in, grounding myself, allowing my head to be still. It's good for us to stop, to reconnect with nature and with God.
