## Hero Moments

As many of you know, I love football. Whether it's following Tottenham Hotspur, keeping an eye on Fulham, cheering on England in the World Cup, and for the next few weeks many of you enjoying the drama of Wimbledon, I love the excitement, the stories, and those unforgettable hero moments.

In football, it might be a Harry Kane goal or a dramatic last-minute winner. At Wimbledon, it's often the player who lifts the trophy who captures the headlines. But those moments don't happen in isolation. They are built on years of dedication, the support of coaches, family, teammates, and countless hours of unseen practice.

Church life is much the same. While some people are more visible, the life of our church depends on everyone playing their part. The quiet prayers, warm welcomes, pastoral conversations, cups of tea, flower arranging, children's work, and countless acts of kindness all help create those wonderful moments when someone encounters God's love or discovers faith afresh.
